**WHO IS ELIGIBLE?** Eligible entities for the CTF program include K-12 schools, libraries, hospitals, health clinics, community colleges, community-based organizations, and government-owned healthcare facilities, each with specific eligibility requirements. Entities must apply and be approved to participate, and all participants must periodically recertify their eligibility. Notably, **there is no rural requirement for eligibility.** View full requirements here.
